Dear friends

*“The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God is at hand,  
repent and believe in the gospel”*

*Mark 1:15 Jesus’ words as he begins his ministry*

These are special times, moving through Advent, to Christmas and then on into the New Year. As we travel through the preparations and the celebrations, the highs and the lows of the season, it gives us a chance to reflect and to look forward to the New Year with hope. We also remind ourselves that God is able to do more than we imagine and God’s presence with us makes all the difference. We look forward to the coming of the King.

The story is told of a man who arrived at a hotel for a conference. He asked the receptionist if they had a room for the night. ‘I am so sorry,’ said the receptionist, ‘but we are fully booked and all the other hotels in the area are probably full too.’

But surely, said the man, you must be able to find a room somewhere. Suppose I was a king in disguise – surely you would find a room for me then? ‘Of course, we would,’ the receptionist responded.

‘Well the king isn’t coming, so please can I have his room?’

For us the King did come in a crowded little town of Palestine. We know the story, the angels made the announcement to the shepherds, who were the least of all the people anyone would expect to hear the good news. They hurried to Bethlehem, so that they could see for themselves. Once they greeted the King in the least of all the kingly places, they rushed off to share the good news.

As we approach another Christmas and New Year we too are waiting for the coming of the King, not only to celebrate his coming to earth as

a baby, but to yearn for his second coming. That second coming that would wipe away all tears, when conflicts will cease and all the broken hearted would be healed. We celebrate the hope which came into the world at Christmas.

As we approach the New Year, we consider the late stragglers who would have arrived sometime after the birth. They were pretty special characters. *Wise men from the east* was how Matthew described them. They had seen a star rising, which proclaimed the one born to be King of the Jews, and came to pay him homage. Matthew must have thought of the prophecy of Isaiah 60:4-6 as he recalled the story. Today we tend to focus on verse 6 which mentions the gifts of gold and frankincense, but the verse goes on to say that they shall bring 'good news, the praise of the Lord.'

So as we celebrate and welcome in the New Year, let us remain watchful and hope for the second coming, as we spread the good news of freedom, equality, justice, and peace. God is with us and he gives us the light to take with us into the New Year and a hope for the future.

### **A prayer**

Father, you make all things new. You bring hope alive in our hearts. We give thanks for the time of preparation, the celebrations and for the New Year ahead. May we seek to create opportunities to make your kingdom a reality on earth.

Come and kindle the flame within us, so that the love which came down at Christmas touches everyone we meet. Amen

May God's love, peace, hope and joy be with you in the coming year.

## **THE MUSE**


